Product Recommendations

Yarn – You will need approximately 150 yards (about 4 oz) to complete the project. Lighter colors provide better stitch visibility which is beneficial for beginners.

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Hook – You will need one crochet hook of Size H (5 mm). If that size is unavailable, size I (5.5 mm will also work).

Scissors – You will need one pair of scissors. Any sharp scissors will work but embroidery scissors/craft scissors tend to cut cleanly.
